## Romantic cards

Copy the outline of the Shape Art hexagon onto white card and cut out. Repeat with design paper and white card as per example. Die-cut the motifs needed. Ink all parts with distress ink walnut stain. Thread ribbon through the circular shape, adhere to white card and trim leaving a narrow border. Adhere all parts to the card as per example. Make a bow of lace and seambinding and secure with a brad. Adhere the Christmas tree to white card, trim leaving a narrow border and secure with 3D-glue. Finish off as shown.

2

Copy the outline of the Shape Art frame onto white card and cut out. Repeat with the other lines using different design papers and white card. Die-cut the motifs needed. Ink all parts with distress ink walnut stain and adhere. Make a bow of lace and seambinding and secure with a brad. Adhere the die-cut tree to design paper, trim leaving a narrow border and secure with 3D-glue. Finish off the card, secure the scrap flowers with 3D-glue.

3

Copy the outline of the Shape Art template onto white card and cut out. Repeat with the other lines using design paper and white card. Die-cut the motifs needed. Ink all parts with distress ink walnut stain. Adhere the decorative white square to white card, trim leaving a narrow border and glue the picture in place. Adhere all parts to the card as shown. Make a bow of lace and sea e scrap flowers with 3D-glue. Make a bow of lace and seambinding and secure with a brad. Finish off the card, secure the scrap flowers with 3D-glue.

## General instructions:

Read the measurements as follows: the sizes in cm are indicated as: first you see the height and then the width. So 10 x 5 cm means 10 cm high and 5 cm wide.

## Folding the card

Cut 21 x 28.2 cm light grey card. Fold in half and unfold. Score (whole width) at 5.5 cm up from the bottom.

Make an incision of 5.5 cm at the bottom into the central fold. Fold both flaps inside.

Cut twice 10.5 x 13.7 cm design paper. Layer inside as shown.

Adhere ribbon to the flaps and then adhere both sides of the flaps to the card (leave centre open). Turn the card as shown, the fold is at the top now.

Take German lace (DK 3109.14 white) and adhere on both sides on the front and back of the light grey card.

## Card front

Central part: cut a 13.6 x 7.8 cm cloud grey strip and 13.6 x 7.3 cm design paper (stars). Adhere together.

Cut 13.6 x 15 cm design paper (wood).

Cut two 13.6 x 5 cm strips of the same pattern from design paper and layer behind on both sides of the cloud grey card. Then adhere to the design paper, with 1 cm of brown visible on each side. The widths are: 1 cm brown, 2.6 cm blue design paper, central part (together 7.8 cm wide), 2.6 cm blue design paper, 1 cm brown.



Die-cut/emboss the oval 1x from gold and 1x with two stencils at the same time (outline and ring) from pearl-white. The centre is open now.

Layer the image behind the aperture in the pearl-white card. Adhere the two ovals together as shown.



Die-cut/emboss the large flower 1x from pearl-white and 1x from vellum. Adhere the flower of vellum overlapping to the centre of the pearl-white one. Die-cut/emboss the small flower from light grey and vellum and the heart from snow paper. Assemble the flower and set aside to dry.

Die-cut/emboss the four leaves from cloud grey, two twigs from gold card and the larch 2x from olive green. Adhere to the top centre of the card.

Die-cut/emboss the two small corners from pearl-white and layer cloud grey behind. Adhere as per example.

Add enamel dots and a white feather to complete.


Take a light grey A4-sheet. Fold (= A in the photo) in half and open again. Make another fold at 12 cm from each side (= B in the photo). C: Score (whole width) at 4 cm up from the bottom. D: Make an incision of 4 cm at the bottom into the central fold.

E: On both sides cut out a corner of 4 x 2,8 cm on the folds. F: Fold both flaps inside and adhere on the sides XXXX (leave centre open). Turn the card, the fold (A) will be at the top.

Cut 11.6 x 16.5 cm cloud grey card and 11.2 x 16.1 cm design paper (star). Adhere to card front as shown.

Fold over the grey flap and adhere on both sides XXXX (leave centre open).

G: Flap at the back. Adhere the ribbon (VV1006) on both sides at the back of the light grey flap. Adhere the flap on both sides (leave centre open).



### Card front

Cut 6 x 17 cm light grey card and 5.7 x 17 cm design paper (wood). Adhere wood design to light grey, with a narrow light grey border visible. Then adhere to the light grey flap on the card front.

Adhere the sides, but leave the centre open.

Die-cut/emboss the oval 2x from metallic. Stamp the text on the oval.

Make a loop with ribbon and thread through the oval.

Die-cut/emboss the oval with two dies at the same time (outer edge and ring) from pearl-white. The centre is now open. Layer the picture behind. Die-cut/emboss the oval 2x from silver card (CA3127) and adhere on both sides behind the pearl-white using 3D-glue.

Set aside to dry.

Die-cut/emboss the flower (left) from ivory, vellum and snow paper and two leaves from silver grey (work with frayed burlap).

Adhere vellum overlapping in the centre of the ivory.

Die-cut/emboss the

flower (right) from light grey, vellum and snow paper.

Die-cut/emboss the pine set from nut brown, dark brown and olive green. Assemble and glue in position on the wood design. Leave the top open for the label.



## 1

Cut a 15 x 10.5 cm pearly white top-fold card and layer 14.5 x 10 cm lightblue card and 14 x 9.5 cm design paper on top.

Cut 10.5 x 3 cm light yellow design paper, die-cut a wavy border and adhere. Die-cut the sea shell from design paper, work with distress ink and adhere. Die-cut the dolly from salmon pink, caramel, grey kraft and design paper. Assemble and adhere. Finish off as shown.

## 2

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm pearly white single-fold card and layer 13 x 13 cm light blue card and 12.5 x 12.5 cm design paper on top.

Die-cut the pergola from silver-coloured card and the grass from design paper, adhere. Die-cut the flowers and leaves from design paper, work with a white gel pen and glitter glue and adhere.

Die-cut the girl, cut off the arms and the right leg. Layer one arm behind. Die-cut the ballet skirt from snow paper, cut it smaller on both sides and adhere. Layer the other arm over the skirt and the leg under the skirt as shown. Die-cut the pony tail several times to make a thick one. Finish off as shown.

## 3

The pattern of this Centre Step card can be downloaded from the Collection #26.

Trace the pattern onto pearly white card and cut out. Cut 12 x 8.8 cm silver-coloured design paper and layer to the centre.

Cut two 11.5 x 2 cm light blue strips and two 11 x 1.5 cm strips from design paper and adhere. Die-cut the branches from green design paper and the tomatoes from red and Christmas red card, adhere on the small strips. Die-cut the fence from pearly white and adhere in front of the tree. Die-cut the soil from grey kraft, work with distress ink and adhere. Die-cut the dolly from salmon pink, nut brown, Christmas red, black and design paper. Assemble and adhere.

Finish off as shown.

## 4

Cut a 15 x 10.5 cm pearly white card and mount 14.5 x 10 cm light blue and 14 x 9.5 cm design paper on top. Die-cut the mountains from light grey, work with ink and adhere. Die-cut the mountains and the snowy scenery in front from pearly white, cut off the mountains and adhere the landscape. Die-cut the peaks from white and the starry border from silver and adhere. Die-cut the dolly and dress it in warm clothes. Finish off the card with stars, a text and diamond gems.



# Christmas Candles

## 1

Die-cut the one but largest ticket 4x from cerise and the two but largest one 4x from design paper. Adhere together.

Die-cut 16.4 x 12.6 cm and 12.6 x 19 cm kraft paper, score a fold in the latter one at 2.5 cm, to create a glue strip. Fold both cards in half and adhere together with the glue strip. Adhere the tickets. Trace the corners on to the kraft paper and cut out.

Die-cut the baskets 4x from kraft paper, the candles 4x from pink and leaves, twigs and berries from various green and brown card and snow paper. Adhere the candles inside the baskets using foam tape.

First basket: cut away three flames, second basket: cut away two flames and third basket: cut away one flame. Colour the remaining flames yellow.

Die-cut four pink tags (LR0187) and stamp the dates of the Advent Sundays.

Thread two bells to ropes, tie to the tags and adhere with foam tape. Instead of bells the card can also be decorated with enamel dots.

## 2

Die-cut the lantern 4x from silver-coloured paper. Cut off protruding parts to get straight edges. Place the lantern parts, silver-coloured side down, closely together. Adhere double-sided tape to the seams.

Cut the windows from mica and adhere to the tape. Fold the lantern together. Adhere double-sided tape to the seam between the last two lantern parts and layer the mica on top.

Adhere the circles on top together to close the lantern.

Die-cut the wreath from various green colours. Cut off 1/3rd from the wreath and use it as the base. Cut the rest of the wreath into small parts.

Shape the leaves and work them with a little gesso. Then adhere them overlapping on the base.

Die-cut the mini-poinsettias from white card, work the petals and adhere together. Adhere to the wreath.

Complete the floral arrangements with die-cut berries and twigs and attach them to the sides of the lantern.

Die-cut the smallest flower of Creatable LR0435 2x. Shape the petals and mount on top of the lantern. Add die-cut leaves and berries. Die-cut berries and pine cones from snow paper.

Create snow with modelling paste.

# Cars & Bikes in Winter

## 1

Die-cut the front and back of the box card from white card. Die-cut the front from design paper as well and adhere to the white card front. Then cut out the aperture. Layer 4.5 x 11.4 cm kraft and 4.1 x 10.9 cm design paper on the sides. Adhere the background inside the card. Use two scraps of snow paper, tear off the top slantwise. Using the wavy border die-cut four 15 cm long strips from snow paper. Adhere one strip under the background. Die-cut three white support strips. Adhere the remaining strips of snow paper to them. Die-cut the other parts from different card colours.

Work the pines and firs with snow effect. Stamp the text on a banner. Finish off the card as shown.

## 2

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm white top-fold card, 12.5 x 12.5 cm design paper and 13 x 13 cm metallic grey, round off the bottom corners and layer together. For the shaker card: die-cut the ticket 1x from design paper and 1x from metallic grey, die-cut an opening in the latter one with a smaller ticket. Layer mica behind. Die-cut the horizon from snow paper and adhere to the ticket of design paper. Adhere double-sided foamtape on the border of the ticket. Die-cut cars, a bike, motorbike and scooter from black, grey and silver card and place in the shaker card. Adhere both parts together.


Die-cut from different card colours: houses, tire tracks, a circle and a text. Work the text with distress ink black soot and the chipboard stars with embossing powder.

Finish off as shown.

## 3

Cut a 14.3 x 29.6 cm white base card and score folds at 14.3 cm and 15.3 cm. Copy the pattern on to the card front. Cut 11 x 11 cm design paper and adhere inside the frame. Finish off the inside of the card front with 9.1 x 9.1 cm design paper, layered on 11.2 x 11.2 cm white card. Cut 13.9 x 13.9 cm design paper and cut out an 11 x 11 cm aperture in the centre. Cut two 2.5 x 11 cm strips from snow paper and grey card. Die-cut the horizon with houses from dark blue and black. Adhere the layers to the card with foamtape. Start at the top with the houses. Die-cut the other parts from different colours.

Cut a piece of snow paper to place under the pines and tear off slantwise. Stamp the text on a scrap of white card and cut out a triangle. Finish off as shown.



# Christmas Decorations

Adhere a piece from the cover of the design paper bloc on top of the match box. Use design paper for the other sides.

Stamp a text on a tag and finish off with clear embossing powder.

Attach die-cut stars and images to finish.

2

How to make an easel card:

Die-cut a double star from kraft, place the die with one tip a little bit away from the folding line, so that the two parts stay attached. Adhere a large star to the folded star.

Die-cut the star with openwork border. Fold this one and the large one with mountain and valley folds. Adhere together.

Adhere the star, that is in 3D now, to the easel card with a big blob of 3D-glue. Mount on top: a smaller star, the one just described and a small openwork star. Use a few layers for the two stars on top to make them sturdy.

Decorate the base of the card with stars as well.

Stamp a text on the tag and finish it off with clear embossing powder.

3

Die-cut three small stars from design paper, stamp a text and decorate one with a tree and snowman.

Punch a hole through the stars, take two bells and thread the items through the net with candles.

4

Die-cut five double stars, place the die with one tip just a little bit away from the folding line, so that the two part stay attached. This way it is easy to hang them over a ribbon.

Decorate the stars with die-cut figures from the decoration set, stars and stamped images.

Use a few layers for the openwork small stars, attached to the ribbon that is hanging down, to make them sturdy. Do this for the word Christmas as well. Adhere ribbon to the back of these stars. Glue small pegs, decorated with design paper and an openwork star, at the back.

Add an adhesive stone to the small stars at the top of the large ones.

5

Garland: die-cut for each light a star from kraft and one with openwork border from design paper. Die-cut a small openwork star from the centre of the latter ones. Make mountain and valley folds in all stars.

Layer together a star from kraft and one from design paper. Make a small opening in the centre for the lights.

Attach the stars around the lights, alternating as a star or a bell.

# Cactus Cards

1

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm white single-fold card and layer 13 x 13 cm design paper on top. Cut 10.5 x 10.5 design paper, round off the corners, layer on black card and trim leaving a narrow border.

Cut a circle from design paper and a text from black card and adhere.

Die-cut the cacti from scraps of card and cork, assemble and adhere using 3D-foam pads.

Die-cut triangles from mirror card and adhere the remaining strip to the card. Thread twine through a flag cut from mirror card to complete the card.

2

Cut an 11 x 15 cm white single-fold card and round off the corners.

Emboss the front of the card with a design folder. Layer 11 x 11.5 cm design paper on top. Die-cut many triangles from gold-coloured mirror card, put into the pay envelope and adhere to the card using washi-tape. Keep the remaining strip of mirror card. Thread twine through a label and adhere. Die-cut the cacti from scraps of card and cork and assemble. Adhere with 3D-foam pads. Adhere the strip of mirror card. Die-cut a text from black card and adhere. Die-cut a few more triangles from cork and adhere.

Finish off the card by stamping a few small motifs.

3

Cut an 11 x 15 cm white single-fold card and round off the corners.

Layer design paper of the same size on top and stamp images along two sides. Die-cut circles in different sizes from design paper, mirror card and cork and adhere playfully. Die-cut the cacti from scraps of card and cork and assemble. Adhere as shown using 3D-foam pads.

Die-cut a text from black card and adhere.

Stamp a few small motifs to complete.

4

Cut an 11 x 15 cm white single-fold card and round off the corners.

Layer design paper of the same size on top. Cut 6 x 12.5 cm design paper, round off the corners and adhere together with 3D-foam pads.

Die-cut the cacti from scraps of card and cork, assemble and adhere using 3D-foam pads. Die-cut a text from black card and adhere.

Cut a flag from mirror-card, thread twine through it and adhere.

Finish off the card with a stamped text.

# Winter Dreams

## 1

Die-cut the plain circle 2x from petrol card and the decorated one 1x from pearl-white metallic. Thread wax cord through the inner holes. Cut a 1 cm wide petrol strip (the length depends on the length of the straw), adhere double-sided tape and then adhere across the straw slantwise. Adhere lace in the same way. Squeeze one side of the straw and glue between the two petrol circles. Layer the white circle and the picture from the decoupage sheet on top.

Die-cut feathers from snow paper and light blue card.

Make a tuft and complete with a bow of lace and wax cord. Add wire with pearls to complete. Finish off the lollypop with diamond gems.

## 2

Die-cut the label from petrol card and vellum.

Trace the inside of the template onto design paper, cut out and adhere. Only glue the vellum to the design paper, making sure the glue will be hidden by a picture or ribbon.

Die-cut the dreamcatcher from taupe card and die-cut a picture from the decoupage sheet. Adhere to the vellum.

Die-cut feathers from petrol and snow paper and adhere.

Die-cut the twine border from snow paper and adhere to the card together with a narrow strip of petrol.

Add a bow, punched butterflies and diamond gems to finish.

## 3

Work the edges of the design paper with distress ink. Cut 13 x 13 cm taupe card and adhere 12.5 x 12.5 cm design paper on top.

Die-cut the strips of the bendy card from taupe card, trace the inside onto design paper and cut out.

Cut off 2 cm at the bottom of the large bended strip and the design paper and adhere together.

Die-cut the dreamcatcher from taupe card and layer a picture from the design paper on top.

Cut 5 x 1 cm thick mica and score folds at 2 and 3 cm.

Adhere the folded mica between the design paper and the dreamcatcher, the

dreamcatcher can wobble now.

Adhere the large bended strip on the left-hand side of the card and \*adhere double-sided tape to the end.

Decide where the bended part will be adhered to the card and mark the spot with a pencil line.

Adhere the small bended strip to the right-hand side and repeat from \*. This part will be adhered to the large strip.

Cut out a picture and adhere.

Decorate the dreamcatcher with die-cut feathers and pictures from the design paper.

## 4


Cut 15 x 15 cm taupe card and layer 14 x 14 cm on top.

Cut 6 x 15 cm and 6 x 6.5 cm strips from design paper and work the edges with distress ink. Die-cut the decorative circle from design paper and the solid one from cerise. Die-cut feathers from design paper and snow paper. Stamp a text onto a small strip of taupe card and work the edges with distress ink. Cut out the picture and adhere the layers to the card as shown.

### TIP:

When using 3D-glue to adhere the tuft in position, it's still possible to change or add something.

Place feathers in a blob of 3D-glue.

Cut blue card into a 12 x 14.5 cm single-fold card and a 3 x 14 cm strip. Cut white card into an 11.5 x 14 cm rectangle and a 6 x 11.85 cm and a 2.5 x 13.5 cm strip. Cut design paper into an 11 x 13.5 rectangle and a 5.5 x 11.5 cm strip. Cut a V-shape into one short side of the white strip, layer onto the blue one and cut out another V-shape. Die-cut all parts for the jacket, assemble and layer onto an 8.5 x 8.5 cm blue square and then on a 9 x 9 cm white one. Stamp the text onto a white scrap and mat on blue. Adhere to the card and add die-cut buttons to complete.

2

Cut kraft into a 14 x 14 cm single-fold card and a 10 x 14 cm strip. Cut white card into a 13.5 x 13.5 cm square and a 9.5 x 14 cm strip. Cut design paper into a 13 x 13 cm square and a 9 x 14 cm strip. Work the edges with distress ink. Die-cut Kim's buddy, the clothes and the boys' set and the nuts and bolts. Stamp a text onto carnation white card and mat on kraft. Adhere to the card as shown and add a length of rope as shown.

3

Cut kraft into a 14.5 x 14.5 cm single-fold card and a 12 x 12 cm square. Cut design paper into 14 x 14 cm and 11.5 x 11.5 cm squares and work the edges with distress ink. Adhere together. Cut out a picture from the decoupage sheet, mat on kraft and work the edges with distress ink. Adhere to the card. Die-cut the grape vine from kraft and moss green, cut off the moss green leaves and adhere to the kraft grape vine, work with distress ink. Die-cut/emboss the bunches of grapes from purple card and work with distress ink while still in the stencil. Die-cut/emboss the parts of the wicker bottle, work with distress ink and assemble. Stamp the words onto a carnation white scrap and mat on kraft. Adhere as per example and work the labels with a gel pen.

4

Cut a 13.5 x 15 cm kraft card and mount 13 x 14.5 cm white card on top. Cut a 12.5 x 6 cm blue strip and adhere along the top of the card. Cut four 5 x 12.5 cm strips: moss green, army green and a cloud grey one. Die-cut two green strips of horizon with cypresses and use the stencil of the horizon without trees to die-cut two green and one grey strip. Work the edges with distress ink. Flip over one strip with trees, so that there are trees on both sides. Adhere the strips stepwise. Die-cut/emboss the other parts and adhere as per example. Stamp a text onto kraft, cut into a road sign and work with distress ink. Adhere to the card and add a bird to complete.

White borders

1

Cut two white strips of 15 x 20 cm (score folds at 2.5 cm and 5 cm) and 15 x 6.5 cm. Cut taupe card into: 14.5 x 14.5 cm and 14.5 x 6 cm and design paper into: 14 x 14 cm and 14 x 5.5 cm. Adhere together but not to the card yet. Tear two corners from wood design paper and adhere. Die-cut/emboss the large and small stencils together from white card. Die-cut the largest border from taupe card. Adhere the large white border to the brown one and cut out the centre slightly smaller. Layer a piece of the fishing net behind and then adhere all layers to the card. Adhere the smallest die-cut shape to taupe and trim leaving a narrow border both on the outside and inside. Layer the picture behind and then adhere to the card. Adhere the shells to taupe, cut out and adhere together adding sprigs. Finish off with a bow.

2

Cut a 30 x 15 cm white strip and score folds at 15 cm, 17 cm, 19 cm and 29 cm. Assemble the card by gluing the last small strip to the back. Adhere 14.5 x 14.5 cm design paper. Die-cut the stencil 2x from white card, cut out the bottom from one shape and use 3D-glue/foam pads to adhere them together and then to the card. Die-cut the two smaller stencils at the same time from white card and use the border. First layer a picture behind and then add to the card. Stamp the text onto a white strip and cut the ends into a V-shape. Finish off with a bow, flowers and sprigs.

3

Cut a 15 x 15 cm white single-fold card and adhere 14.5 x 14.5 cm wood design paper and 14 x 14 design paper with circles on top. Die-cut/emboss the stencil from white card and layer a picture behind. Die-cut the border from wood design paper and adhere the layers to the card. Die-cut the small stencil from white card. Stamp a text onto white card, trace the inside of the small stencil around the text and cut out. Adhere with 3D-glue/foam pads. Finish off with a bow and pearls.

## 1

Die-cut the label from kraft. Trace the inside of the stencil in pencil onto the back of design paper and cut out.

Cut 16 x 4.5 cm design paper and die-cut part of the label lengthwise. Adhere the layers together.

Die-cut a circle from design paper and one from vellum, adhere together and to the card.

Apply glue to the bottom half of the circle only, so it's not visible.

Tear/cut a 2 x 10 cm strip from snow paper, die-cut the sides in shape using the circle stencil.

Die-cut the tree from kraft and pine green. Die-cut the mouse and lantern, assemble and adhere. Finish off as shown.

Die-cut the card stand from pearly white card. Trace the inside of the stencil onto the back of design paper. Cut out and adhere.

## 2

Cut a 15 x 10.5 cm single-fold card from kraft and layer 14.5 x 10 cm pearly white and 14 x 9.5 cm design paper on top.

Tear/cut vellum and design paper into 4 x 15 cm strips and adhere overlapping. Use the wavy stencil to die-cut a sand border of approximately 1.5 x 15 cm from white card and adhere.

Die-cut the coral from cerise and adhere.

Die-cut the other shapes from various colours, assemble and glue in position. Finish off with a text, adhesive stones and droplets.

## 3

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm top-fold card from grey kraft and layer 13 x 13 cm vellum on top. Apply glue/tape to the bottom half only, so it's not visible. Tear/cut two 4.5 x 13.5 cm strips from design paper and adhere overlapping. Die-cut the farm, and a fence, assemble and glue in position. Die-cut the sunflowers, use a brown marker and white gel pen to draw dots in the heart of the flowers, assemble and adhere.

Die-cut the cow, assemble adhere.

Finish off as shown.

## 4


Trace the pattern of the card onto grey kraft and cut out. Adhere smaller semi circles of design paper on top. Cut 14 x 9.5 cm vellum and 13.5 x 9 cm pearly white card for the inside.

Cut a 22.5 x 8 cm long white strip, score folds at 6 cm and 16.5 cm, fold into a sleeve and adhere. Layer 10.5 x 7.5 cm design paper to the front of the sleeve. Add a vellum circle.

Die-cut the onesie and stork, adhere together and to the sleeve.

Finish off with a text and adhesive stones.

Take the canvas and lightly draw in pencil the landscape you have in mind. Start off at the top with the sky and use baby blue card. Draw and cut the mountain in the back from grey and the mountain in front from mouse grey. Cut a small arc out of the mountain in front to make a cave. Finish off the border with a curved piece of grey paper, adhere with 3D-tape/glue. Make the ice sheet from light grey and the rolling landscape from several green colours and a piece of recycled green kraft. Use recycled green and blue kraft for the two high mountains with the water in between. Below are three more green strips with a rolling landscape, followed by the beach, made of cream and daffodil yellow. The wavy water is made of baby blue, azure blue and turquoise. Complete the landscape with a strip of wavy kraft, for which the die of the Collectable Eline's whale was used. Start decorating with the items in the back, like the autumn trees, reed, water, floe and branches. Tie a rope between the branches and hang many lanterns onto it. Then die-cut the animals from various colours, assemble and glue them in position. Finish off the canvas with leaves, flowers, plants, snowflakes, clouds, enamel dots and pearls.

# Masking Technique

## General instructions:

Cut a rectangle or square from PCP, the size is indicated below. Stamp the images with Archival jet black by using the masking technique. Follow the step-by-step photos for each card. Set aside to dry and then colour in with Copic markers or other colouring materials. To make clouds in the sky: draw clouds on scrap paper, cut out along the outline. Then dab distress ink tumbled glass along the wavy paper border onto the white PCP card.

### 1

Cut a 14.5 x 14.5 cm top-fold card from kraft. Cut 13.25 x 13.25 cm and 13.75 x 13.75 cm design paper, mat the large one on pearly white. Then adhere together. Die-cut a circle and ticket from design paper. Cut 12.25 x 12.25 cm from pearly white and emboss snowflakes. Cut 14 x 11.75 cm from PCP, stamp the image as shown and colour in. Work the sky with pan pastel. Stamp the duck and owl, colour in and cut out. Adhere to the card raised with 3D-glue. Stamp a text with Archival red geranium and cut into a label. Cut a similar label from design paper and tie them together.

### 2

Cut a 15 x 12.5 cm top-fold card from kraft. Cut 14 x 11.5 cm design paper, mat on purple and then on raven black. Adhere together. Die-cut a rectangle and ticket from orange card. Die-cut a label from purple and raven black. Tie rope through the labels. Cut 13.5 x 10.25 cm from PCP, stamp the image as shown and colour in. Work the sky with pan pastel. Stamp the butterfly, pumpkins, duck and mouse, colour in and cut out. Adhere to the card raised with 3D-glue.

### 3

Cut 21.75 x 14 cm kraft and 21.25 x 13.5 cm pearly white card. Round off the corners with a punch. Adhere together and score at 9.25 cm and 17.5 cm. Cut 8.75 x 1.25 cm and 8.25 x 13.25 cm design paper and adhere. Die-cut a banner, two circles and two tickets from design paper. Die-cut three rectangles from PCP. Stamp the images as shown and colour in. Make the clouds in the sky. Die-cut the clouds from the bendy card from PCP, work the edges with distress ink tumbled glass. Stamp the texts and cut into labels. Cut two similar labels from design paper and tie together with rope.

### 4

Cut a 30.5 x 13.75 cm strip from kraft and score folds at 17.25 cm (valley fold), 1.75 cm (mountain fold) and at 20.25 cm (valley fold). Cut off two corners slantwise, starting at 2.75 cm in from the tip. Fold the card and adhere with a piece of tape. Cut 12.75 x 16.50 cm design paper. Cut slanting corners again and mat on pearly white. Die-cut the banner, label, circle, rectangle and tickets from design paper. Cut 12.25 x 15.5 cm from PCP, stamp the image as shown and colour in. Work the sky with pan pastel and water. Stamp the text with Archival cobalt and cut into a label. Cut a similar label from design paper and tie together.

## General instructions:

Die-cut a number of circles (8 cm Ø) and squares (8 x 8 cm) from water-colour paper and make pretty combinations with texts and stamps. The stamp master is a handy tool to use for stamping. Colour in the images and finish off the cards.

### 1

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm red single-fold card and layer 10 cm on top. Choose a picture and adhere to the card front. Die-cut a star and a border of stars from snow paper and adhere. Decorate the snow with glitter glue and embellish the card with enamel dots.

### 2

Cut a 13.5 x 13.5 cm red single-fold card. Die-cut three banners from design paper and adhere to the card front. Layer the picture on top. Die-cut the border of stars from snow paper and use both the border and the die-cut stars. Decorate the floe with glitter glue and embellish the tips of the banners with an enamel dot.

### 3

Die-cut a 14 x 14 cm black single-fold card and layer 13.5 x 13.5 cm design paper on top. Die-cut four 6.3 x 6.3 cm squares and adhere to the card front. Die-cut a 10 cm Ø circle. Die-cut the border of stars from snow paper and adhere to the card, together with the die-cut stars.

# Layered stamps

## General instructions:

Apply distress ink vintage photo to the edges of the paper. Stamp the flowers and leaves onto white stamping paper, cut out and make them 3D.

### 1

Cut 12 x 7.5 cm stamping paper and stamp a text, using black ink and the Stamp Master. Cut 12.5 x 8 cm stamping paper and colour it pink with distress ink. Stamp a few petals of the hydrangea (step 4) in red (love letter) Memento ink.

Cut 13.5 x 9 cm pearly white and adhere on a 15 x 10.5 cm single-fold kraft card.

Stamp all flowers and leaves onto stamping paper, using the Stamp Master and Memento ink. Cut out and glue in position using 3D-glue.

### 2

Cut 12 x 12 cm stamping paper and stamp leaves and dots in green following the instructions for layered stamping.

Sprinkle a few water drops on the stamped paper to create lighter spots. Adhere the paper to 12.5 x 12.5 cm orange, 13.5 x 13.5 cm pearly white and a 15 x 15 cm brown single-fold card.

Stamp a 12 x 2 cm strip and a branch from stamping paper, colour them brown with distress ink and adhere.

Stamp the big leaves, squirrel and acorns with Memento ink onto stamping paper and cut out. Glue in position with 3D-glue.

### 3

Cut 11 x 11 cm stamping paper and stamp leaves and dots in brown ink, following the instructions for layered stamping. Then adhere the paper to 11.5 x 11.5 cm dark brown, 12.5 x 12.5 cm pearly white and a 14 x 14 cm cerise single-fold card.

Stamp onto stamping paper the flowers in different autumn shades and the leaves in green using Memento ink and then adhere to the card with 3D-glue. Finish off with a bow.

### 4

Cut a 3 x 12.5 cm strip from stamping paper and stamp leaves using Memento ink. Then colour the strip with brown distress ink.

Cut 11 x 12 cm pearly white card and adhere to 12.5 x 12.5 cm cerise and a 13.5 x 13.5 cm single-fold card. Stamp the text onto a 9 x 2.2 cm white strip, cut out a triangle and adhere. Finish off with a poinsettia, holly and adhesive flat-backed pearls.

### 5

Cut 6.5 x 10 cm stamping paper and work with distress ink. Stamp the amaryllis onto it using Memento ink bamboo leaves. Adhere to 12 x 12 cm pearly white, 12.5 x 12.5 cm cerise and then onto a 13.5 x 13.5 cm pearly white single-fold card. Cut 10 x 3 cm stamping paper and colour it with Memento ink bamboo leaves and new sprout,

and on top distress ink twisted citron.

Stamp the text onto a 7 x 1.3 cm pearly white strip and adhere.

Stamp the holly, hellebore and the amaryllis and adhere.

Finish off with adhesive pearls.

Instructions on how to make a background with the Stamp Master

1

Colour white stamping paper with distress ink. Start at the side with the darkest colour and use lighter colours while working towards the centre. Leave a light spot in the centre.

2

Stamp with the layered stamps and Memento ink randomly leaves onto the stamping paper.

3

Use a satay stick to make several 'dots' on the paper.

Make the edges of the paper darker with distress ink vintage photo.

### Working with the Stamp Master

The instructions on how to work with the Stamp Master and the layered stamps are on the back of the packaging.

You will need to follow these four steps to make the complete image.

Start off with stamp 1 (the solid one with the outline).



- Fix the stamping paper inside the Stamp Master. The maximum paper size is 14.5 x 14.5 cm.
- Position the first stamp where you like to stamp and close the Stamp Master. The stamp will now stick to the lid.
- Apply a pale ink colour to the stamp. Stamp the image onto the stamping paper. Should the image not be clear enough, apply more ink and stamp again.
- Then place the step-2-stamp onto the stamped image, accurately lined up so that the outline sits on top of the other one. Close the lid to make the stamp stick to the lid again. Ink up the stamp this time with a slightly darker colour and close the Stamp Master.



- Repeat with the step-3 and step-4 stamps and keep using a slightly darker colour.

### Tips:

Clean the stamp each time after using. Less discoloration of the stamps will occur and it will be clean and ready to be used again.

The Stamp Master and stamps are best cleaned with lukewarm water and mild soap.

The more you use the same ink colour and the same stamp, the darker the image on the stamping paper will become.
